KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Andrew Karolyi



Andrew Karolyi is the Alumni Professor in Asset Management at the Samuel Curtis Johnson Graduate School of Management at Cornell University. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from the University of Chicago. He has published extensively in journals in finance and economics, including the Journal of Finance, Journal of Financial Economics and Review of Financial Studies, and has published several books and monographs. His research has been covered extensively in the media, including The Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, The Economist, TIME, The New York Times, The Washington Post, Forbes, BusinessWeek and CNBC.

Dr. Karolyi currently serves as executive editor of the *Review of Financial Studies* and has served as an associate editor for a variety of journals, including the *Journal of Finance, Journal of Finance, Journal of Finance Journal of Finance, Teview of Finance* and the *Pacific Basin Finance Journal*. He is a recipient of the Fama/DFA Prize for Capital Markets and Asset Pricing, the William F. Sharpe Award for Scholarship in Finance, the *Journal of Empirical Finance's* Biennial Best Paper Prize, the Fisher College of Business' Pace Setter Awards for Excellence in Research and Graduate Teaching and Johnson's Prize for Excellence in Research.

He joined the Johnson Graduate School of Management at Cornell in 2009, after teaching for 19 years at The Ohio State University Fisher College of Business. He leads various executive education programs in the U.S., Canada, Europe and Asia, and is actively involved in consulting with corporations, banks, investment firms, stock exchanges and law firms. He currently chairs the board of trustees and is past president of the Financial Management Association International and has served as a director of the American Finance Association.

Anup Agrawal is the William A. Powell, Jr. Chair of Finance and Banking at the University of Alabama. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from the University of Pittsburgh. He has served on the editorial board of several journals including the *Journal of Corporate Finance* and *Journal of Financial Research*. His work has been included in the *Journal of Law and Economics* list of "Top 20 most cited papers ever published in JLE."

Ian R. Appel is an assistant professor of finance at Boston College. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from the University of Pennsylvania. His work has been published in the *Journal of Financial Economics*. He has won the Michael J. Barclay Young Scholar Award.

Gurdip Bakshi is the Dean's Professor of Finance at the University of Maryland. He holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Wisconsin. He serves as co-editor of the Review of Derivatives Research and has served as associate editor for several journals including the *Review of Financial Studies*, *Review of Asset Pricing Studies*, and *Journal of Financial and Quantitative Analysis*. He has received the Merton Miller Prize for the best paper in the *Journal of Business*.

Jess Cornaggia is an assistant professor of finance and Anderson Faculty Fellow at Georgetown University. He holds a Ph.D. in management science from the University of Texas at Dallas. His work has been published in the *Journal of Financial Economics, Review of Financial Studies* and *Management Science*.

David L. Dicks is an assistant professor of finance at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from Northwestern University. His work has been published in the *Review of Financial Studies*.

Nickolay Gantchev is an assistant professor of finance at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from the University of Pennsylvania. His work has been published in the *Journal of Financial Economics*.

Samuel M. Hartzmark is an assistant professor of finance at the University of Chicago. He holds a Ph.D. in finance from the University of Southern California.
