



Lord Clement-Jones, a Peer in the House of Lords of Parliament since 1988, is now the Party's health spokesman in the Lords. After working as a volunteer he joined the Streatham Liberal Association (1973) and later became their ward organizer.

In 1976 he became the Secretary to the Association of Liberal Lawyers, campaigning for civil liberties and legal aid. In 1980 he became the prospective parliamentary candidate for Streatham and was elected to the Liberal Policy Committee and joined the National Executive. Lord Clement-Jones was Chairman of the Liberal Party 1986-1988 and played a significant part in the merger negotiations with the SDP to form the Liberal Democrats.

Lord Clement-Jones is now the Chairman of DLA Upstream the government relation's practice of DLA the major law firm.

He was born in Wales in 1949 and educated at Haileybury and Trinity College Cambridge. Married in 1994 to wife Jean, they reside in London, England, with their son Harry.
